ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW BOARD APPLICATION CHECKLIST LANDSCAPE & TREE PRESERVATION PLAN SUBMITTAL

Submittal Instructions

The City of Frontenac **Architectural Review Board** (ARB) was established consistent with Chapter 120, Article IV, section 120.200 of Frontenac Code of Ordinances, updated in 2021. The ARB reviews all new construction, changes and accessory building plans to preserve existing areas of natural beauty and/or cultural importance and assure that buildings, structures, signs or other developments are of good design, harmonious with surrounding developments and in general contribute to the overall appearance of Frontenac. Also refer to the Code of Ordinances Chapter 500 Adoption of Construction and Property Maintenance Codes.

The landscape ordinance was established in 2005, updated in 2011, and again in 2021. Refer to the Code of Ordinances Chapter 250 related to Weeds, High Grass or Other Vegetation and Chapter 425 pertaining to the Tree Preservation and Landscape Standards for the new requirements.

Submit the completed Construction Permit Application, applicable fee (s) and the Check List as the cover letter for your ARB application and landscape and tree preservation submittal along with Five copies of the items on the checklist to the Building Department. Initial the applicant boxes on the checklists to indicate that your submittal contains all the requirements or indicate that the requirement it is not applicable with "NA". Complete submittals will be reviewed as received and should be submitted to the Building Department by 11:00 am at least one week prior to the regularly scheduled Architectural Review Board (ARB) meeting to assure time for staff review and placement on the meeting agenda.

These required submittal documents for the ARB Construction, Landscape and Tree Preservation Plan review correlate with the updated ordinances referenced above. The Check List below is a guide to the requirements of the ARB Construction and Landscape Plan and Tree Preservation Review. It is the applicant's responsibility to research and comply with all ordinances <u>and</u> any subdivision indentures or Bylaws that have bearing on the project.

Additional Information:

- Professionally sealed plans are not required for ARB review.
- Plans for projects involving alterations and repairs, which do not affect the outward appearance of a building, and existing decks,
 generators, HVACs, a backyard fence compliant with the city regulations, window replacements and roofing shingle replacements
 shall not require approval of the Architectural Review Board.
- Revised plans with any changes predicated by the ARB will need to be submitted with the building permit application to the Building Department with evidence of notification of trustees or Alderman, as applicable.
- Violating any provision of the ARB guidelines may result in a stop work order and subject applicant to punishment as provided in section 100.140 of the code of ordinances.
- The ARB may require applicant to establish an escrow with the City in an amount determined by the ARB or Building Commissioner
 to be sufficient to remedy any failure to fulfill the conditions specified by the ARB and complete the project in conformity with a
 conditional approval.
- Frontenac has a permit filing fee of 25% of the permit fee for residential projects and 50% of the permit fee for commercial projects. When the permit is picked up, the filing fee will be deducted from the final permit fee. If a project is abandoned and the permit is not issued, the filing fee is not refundable.
- By signing this application, you acknowledge understanding that by submitting an incomplete application, your petition will not be added to the meeting
 agenda. Further, you understand that review of construction plans will not be initiated until appropriate building permit application is completed and
 fees paid.
