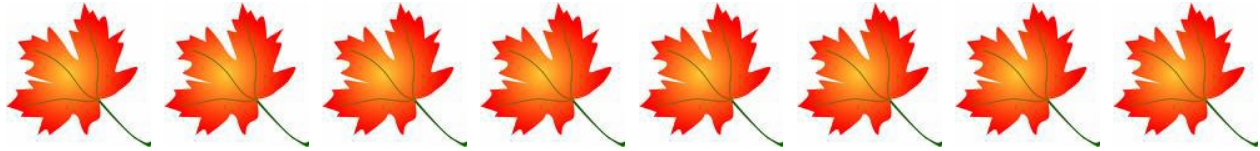

## LEAF COLLECTION 2024



The City of Frontenac will again provide the curbside leaf collection program through Hendel Lawncare, Inc. Collection will begin during the week of October 29.

The schedule lists the beginning date when leaves must be out. Every attempt will be made to maintain the schedule, but residents should be prepared for delays due to inclement weather. If leaves are put out after the final scheduled pass, you can pay for a late pickup by contacting Hendel Lawncare at (314) 863-1420.

In addition to the curbside leaf collection program, your regular trash hauler, Gateway Disposal will continue to provide weekly yard waste removal. Leaves and other loose yard waste should be placed in trash cans or paper bags at the curb as usual before 7:00 a.m. on Monday of each week.

The leaf vacuuming process will create dust and a small amount of leaf debris. We cannot be responsible for the dust on vehicles or other items of personal property.

Each section may be completed in one day or could take up to seven days per pass to complete.

**All piles must be out before 8:00 a.m. of the scheduled start date.** Any piles put out after the vacuum has passed on a side of a street will not be picked up until the next scheduled date.

All dates are subject to change or take longer to complete due to weather conditions.

We require that the bulk of leaves be put out prior to the fourth pass, taking into consideration the potential cancellation of the final pass due to winter weather conditions.

### **DOS**

- ❖ Keep your piles long and narrow along the front of your property; the equipment will reach only 10 feet into your yard.
- ❖ Leaves should be in open areas, not under bushes, trees, or mailboxes to allow access by the equipment.

### **DON'TS**

- ❖ **DO NOT ALLOW CHILDREN TO PLAY IN LEAF PILES.**
- ❖ For fire and life safety issues, **DO NOT** pile leaves in the street or on the sidewalks. Leaves must be placed on your lawn, near the street.
- ❖ Please remove rocks, bricks, glass, branches or other hard materials. Such items are harmful to the equipment and may injure an employee during collection. Any pile containing such debris will be passed by.

Piles blocked with parked cars will not be picked up.

### **Special Notice:**

To ensure sufficient emergency access for fire department vehicles, please trim branches hanging over the streets to height of at least 12 feet. Thank you for your assistance!

Pass 1: Tues., October 29  
Pass 2: Tues., November 12  
Pass 3: Mon., November 25  
Pass 4: Tues., December 10  
Final Pass: Wed., December 18

**QUADRANT 2:** Streets NORTH of Clayton Rd. and EAST of Spoede Rd. to start:  
Pass 1: Tues., October 29  
Pass 2: Wed., November 13  
Pass 3: Mon., November 25  
Pass 4: Wed., December 11  
Final Pass: Wed., December 18

**QUADRANT 3:** Streets SOUTH of Clayton Rd. and WEST of Geyer Rd. to start:  
Pass 1: Wed., October 30  
Pass 2: Thurs., November 14  
Pass 3: Tues., November 26  
Pass 4: Thurs., December 12  
Final Pass: Thurs., December 19

**QUADRANT 4:** Streets SOUTH of Clayton Rd. and EAST of Geyer Rd. to start:  
Pass 1: Wed., October 30  
Pass 2: Fri., November 15  
Pass 3: Wed., November 27  
Pass 4: Fri., December 13  
Final Pass: Thurs., December 19
